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BEFORE YOU START

Many of the organizations listed here receive grants and federal funds. They are mandated to provide services and assistance, so take your timegoing through this guide, read the requirements, and make use of what they have to offer.

HOW TO CONTACT AGENCIES AND GET RESULT

- 1 Take notes. Have paper and pencil ready when you make a call. Be ready to give a brief but complete account of what you need. Eliminate unrelated information.
- 2 Be ready to provide your full name and contact information, including how and where you can be reached or receive messages.
- **3** If your inquiry involves an agency that uses an identifying case or file number, be sure to have that ready.
- **4** Be sure to record the name and title of people you talk to, and confirm their phone numbers in your notes.
- 5 Take the time to say THANK YOU to those who assist you!
- 6 Keep your notes organized by your contacts to each agency so that you can easily supply information when you make follow-up calls.

STREET WISESAFETY TIPS

Stay Alert and tuned into your surrounding wherever you are.

Act as if you're calm, confident, and know where you are going.

Don't accept rides from someone you don't know and/or trust.

Trust your instincts. If something or someone makes you uneasy, avoid the person or situation and leave as soon as possible.

Know the neighborhoods where you spend time, including locations of fire and police stations.

Try to walk places with your friends rather than alone.

Stick to well-travelled and brightly-lit streets. Avoid shortcuts through

wooded areas, parking lots, and alleys.

Take the safest route when travelling on foot.

Don't display your cash or valuables, including items such as cell phones.

Carry your backpack or purse close to your body and keep it closed. If you are carrying your wallet, put it inside your coat or pants pocket, not in your bag. Always keep your I.D. and other important papers safe and close.

If you think you are being followed switch directions or cross the street. If you believe they're still following you, move quickly toward an area with more people. Don't be afraid to yell for help. You could also try walking into a store or other public area.

If someone tries to rob you, give up your property— don't give up your life. Report the crime to the police immediately. Try to describe the attacker as accurately as possible. Your actions can help prevent others from becoming victims.

Be alert and report suspicious activity.

- **1** Percentage of Income Payment Plan (PIPP) Under PIPP, an eligible client pays a percentage of their income and receives a monthly benefit towards their utility. To enroll in the PIPP, contact your local LIHEAP administering agency.
- **2** Summer Assistance Program
 A one-time \$30 credit for household incomes up to 200 percent of the poverty level. Program Dates: June 1 Aug. 31. Apply at your local LIHEAP administering agency.

3 Fresh Start

LIHEAP-approved space-heating customers may qualify to participate in the Fresh Start Arrearage Reduction Program, which provides monthly credits of up to \$150 a month for qualifying customers who begin and continue to pay their electric bills on time

4 Residential Special Hardship Fund Help is available for households with financial hardship due to job loss, illness, military deployment, disability, or seniors. Residential customers can apply once every 2 years for grants of up to \$500 based on need and availability of funds. This fund applies to customers with incomes up to 250% of the federal poverty level.

5 C.H.A.M.P (ComEd Helps Activated Military Personnel): Special services and benefits, including a one-time cash stipend, deferred billing, extended due dates, and late charges cancellation. Eligibility: Military deployment and disabled veterans with 2 years or more of service
