

How to Contact Agencies and Get Results

Take notes. Have paper and pencil ready when you make a call. Be ready to give a brief but complete account of what you need. Eliminate unrelated information.

Be ready to provide your full name and contact information, including how and where you can be reached or receive messages.

If your inquiry involves an agency that uses an identifying case or file number, be sure to have that ready.

Be sure to record the name and title of people you talk to, and confirm their phone numbers in your notes.

Keep your notes organized by your contacts to each agency so that you can easily supply information when you make follow-up calls.

Take the time to say THANK YOU to those who assist you!

Streetwise Safety Tips

Stay Alert and tuned into your surrounding wherever you are.

Act as if you're calm, confident, and know where you are going.

Don't accept rides from someone you don't know and/or trust.

Trust your instincts. If something or someone makes you uneasy, avoid the person or situation and leave as soon as possible.

Know the neighborhoods where you spend time, including locations of fire and police stations.

Try to walk places with your friends rather than alone.

Stick to well-travelled and brightly-lit streets. Avoid shortcuts through wooded areas, parking lots, and alleys.

Take the safest route when travelling on foot.

Don't display your cash or valuables, including items such as cell-phones.

Carry your backpack or purse close to your body and keep it closed. If you are carrying your wallet, put it inside your coat or pants pocket, not in your bag. Always keep your I.D. and other important papers safe and close.

If you think you are being followed switch directions or cross the street. If you believe they're still following you, move quickly toward an area with more people. Don't be afraid to yell for help. You could also try walking into a store or other public area

If someone tries to rob you, give up your property – don't give up your life. Report the crime to the police immediately. Try to describe the attacker as accurately as possible. Your actions can help prevent others from becoming victims

Be alert and report suspicious activity.

Transitional housing is a 6 to 9 month follow-up program that helps graduates and their families adjust to independent living. In transitional living apartments, clients pay a program fee each month, must be employed, can attend school and live as independently as possible in a nominally supervised setting, before moving into their own home.

Panhandling Laws

Ordinance #070180 relates to panhandling. It is unlawful to engage in aggressive panhandling. Any act of panhandling is unlawful under the following circumstances:

Within 20 feet of an automated teller machine (ATM) or ATM facility, or within 20 feet of any entrance or exit to a building containing an ATM

In exchange for washing, protecting, or watching a motor vehicle

Within 5 feet of a curb or edge of a street

Involving any operator or occupant of a motor vehicle that is in traffic, on the street, or on any public passageway

Within 20 feet of any entrance or exit to public buildings or outdoor dining areas

On any private property unless notified otherwise by the owner of said property

In any public transportation vehicle or at any area designated as a place to wait for such vehicles

Using a sound amplification device that is gas-powered or requires batteries larger than 12 volts

Within 20 feet of any walk-up or drive-up teller window of any financial institution

Violation of this ordinance can result in fines, community service, and/or imprisonment.
